

## Dreadful

The word of the day is **dreadful**.

**Dreadful** is an adjective. If something is **dreadful**, it is very bad, shocking or terrible.

“Awful” is the synonym of **dreadful**.

For example, “Those children have such **dreadful** manners.”

“He was admitted to the hospital with a **dreadful** pain in his stomach.”

“I heard **dreadful** things about the Second World War.”

“My little brother is afraid of ghosts, zombies and other **dreadful** creatures.”



## Drowsy

The word of the day is **drowsy**.

**Drowsy** is an adjective. When you are **drowsy**, you have low energy and you can't keep your eyes open.

“Sleepy” is the synonym of **drowsy**.

For example, “**Drowsy** driving is extremely dangerous.”

“Some pills can make you **drowsy**.”

“The warm blanket made me comfortable and **drowsy**.”

“John gets **drowsy** in his literature class.”



## Tantrum

The word of the day is **tantrum**.

**Tantrum** is a noun. It is a noisy outburst of anger.

“Fit” is the synonym of **tantrum**.

For example, “Are parents allowed to throw **tantrums**?”

“I throw **tantrums** when I am frustrated or angry.”

“A **tantrum** is not the best way to get what you want.”

“She was embarrassed by her daughter's **tantrum** at the grocery store.”
