The word of the day is **fierce**.

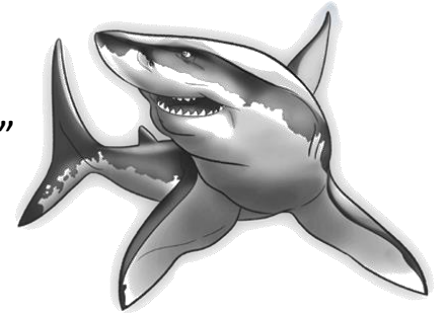
Fierce is an adjective. If something is **fierce**, it is very intense, very bad or hostile. "Strong and terrible" are synonyms of **fierce**.

For example, "He is a **fierce** competitor."

"100 flights were cancelled due to a **fierce** snowstorm."

"A **fierce** squirrel attacked a little boy in the park."

"William is a **fierce** hockey player."



Defiant

The word of the day is **defiant**.

Defiant is an adjective. If a person is **defiant**, it means he refuses to do what you ask him.

"Rebellious and challenging" are synonyms of **defiant**.

For example, "Jack has been very **defiant** lately."

"I don't know how to deal with my **defiant** brother."

"Jimmy was **defiant**, as he refused to do his homework."

"I am not a **defiant** person."



Ecstatic

The word of the day is **ecstatic**.

Ecstatic is an adjective. If a person is **ecstatic**, he is very happy.

"Enthusiastic and thrilled" are synonyms of **ecstatic**.

For example, "My sister was **ecstatic** to get a new Barbie doll."

"My parents were **ecstatic** when I showed them my exam."

"I've been looking forward to this moment so long, but I wasn't **ecstatic** when it has finally arrived."

"I was **ecstatic** when I found out we were going to Disney World."
