

Borrow

The word of the day is **borrow**.

Borrow is a verb. When you **borrow** something from someone, you use it for a short time. Then you return it.

“Rent” is a synonym of **borrow**.

For example, “Can I **borrow** your pencil, please?”

“She **borrowed** five dollars from her friend.”

“I want to **borrow** an English book from the library.”



Fidget

The word of the day is **fidget**.

Fidget is a verb.

It means to move your body nervously or impatiently.

“Wiggle” is a synonym of **fidget**.

For example, “John always **fidgets** in the class.”

“Do you **fidget** or sit still while at your desk?”

“Some students need to **fidget** to stay focused.”



Celebrate

The word of the day is **celebrate**.

Celebrate is a verb.

It means to make something very special.

You can **celebrate** your birthday.

“Ignore” is the opposite of **celebrate**.

For example, “We **celebrate** Halloween on the 31st of October.”

“Chinese people do not **celebrate** Christmas; they **celebrate** Spring Festival.”

“That’s great! I think we should **celebrate** it!”

“Do you **celebrate** World Nutella Day?”
